

## **Event Description:**

The Crushed Rock Classic is a multi-surface, 6 mile circuit with a little bit of everything.

The race will include sections of crushed rock, pavement, and prairie trail. The terrain is undulating with two short, steep climbs per lap. Riders will race 7 or 5 laps in the "A" and "B" races respectively.

## **KOM Primes:**

The KOM competition will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> lap of the race. 1 rider from each category will be awarded on each of the 2 KOM's. Riders limited to 1 KOM.

#### Prize list:

First place in each category, and the first finishing junior, will receive an amazing Crushed Rock Classic trophy.
